PROGRAM NOTE

The Planning Department is interested in your opinions on a number of issues affecting our neighborhood. At the request of City Council, they are preparing a report on the five historic districts in the city. In order to include citizen input into this report, Planning has prepared a survey which will be mailed to all homeowners in the near future. The questions asked will relate directly to the manner in which living in an historic district has affected you. In conjunction with this, the Civic League program on May 2 will be presented by the staff of the Planning Department and will focus on the benefits of living in an historic district. While some residents have problems with the historic designation, it is important to realize that our community is surrounded by industrial development and the loss of our historic status could take Port Norfolk down the same road traveled by Pinner's Point and Newtown. If you receive your survey prior to the Civic League meeting, bring the completed form with you and give it to the Planning staff.
