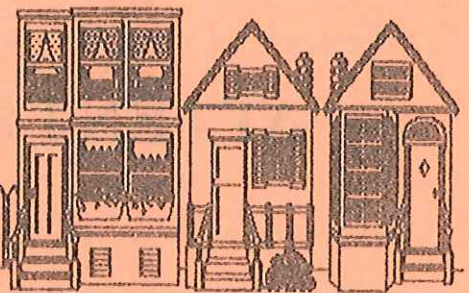
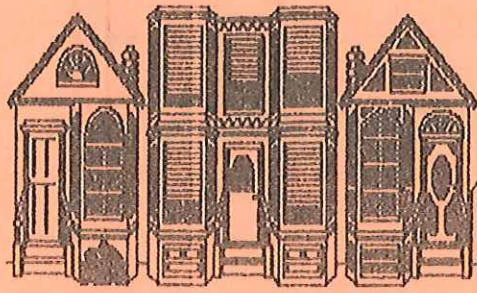

ATTENTION FRIENDS & NEIGHBORS

Saturday August 21st will be a special bulk refuse pick-up day. The City of Portsmouth is making a special effort to help us clean up our neighborhood. So roll up those sleeves, get out the rakes and wheelbarrows, and let's go to work cleaning up our properties.

Refuse containers will be placed in the neighborhood for the convenience of the refuse trucks. This will save each truck the long drive to the Suffolk landfill. Bulk refuse crews will start early Saturday morning picking up bulk refuse and appliances. All refuse and appliances must be at curbside by 7:00 am Saturday morning.

REMEMBER THE BASICS

No cardboard boxes or plastic bags at the curbside. Separate appliances from bulk refuse (tree limbs, furniture, yard waste)

Refrigerated appliances must have the freon removed before being picked up. Call 393-8663 for assistance in complying with this law. Hazardous waste cannot be picked up by the City. Paint, oil, pesticides, solvents and chemicals are examples of hazardous waste. Call S.P.S.A. at 420-4700 for information concerning their disposal.

Building materials are not bulk refuse and are the responsibility of the contractor to be disposed of properly. Tires are not to be placed in with bulk refuse.

For more information concerning bulk refuse, call the Department of General Services at 393-8663.

Remember to respect your neighbors property by not allowing you dog to roam free. Dogs being walked on a leash should be cleaned up after if they litter private or public property.
